
HADLOW DOWN.

A hamlet in the parish of Mayfield, about four miles southwest of the town. In consequence of its distance from the parish church an ecclesiastical district was formed from this parish and those of Framfield and Buxted. The benefice is a perpetual curacy, alternately in the gift of the incumbents of the parishes of Mayfield and Buxted. It is now held by the Rev. Reginald Rivers Kirby, B.A., of St. John's College, Cambridge. Hadlow House was for many generations the property of the old Sussex family of Day, collateral descendants of Bishop Day, of Chichester, and now represented by W. Ansell Day, Esq. The church, which is a neat structure, was consecrated in 1836, and is dedicated to St. Mark.
